GFCI, or Ground Fault Circuit Interrupters, are the outlets typically located in your bathroom, kitchen and garage that are intended to protect you from electrical shock. These outlets have 2 buttons, one marked 'test' and

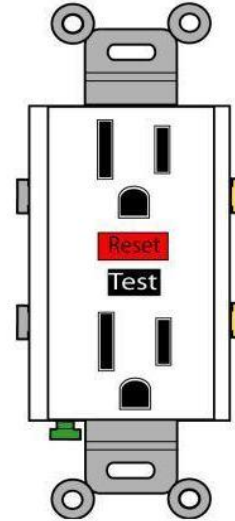
Tip #3: When using electrical power tools be sure you are plugged into a GFCI protected circuit or power cord.

Tip #4: Locate your water & gas shut off valves

Look for your main water shut off valve near the wall closest to the street on the lowest level of your home. Individual water shut off valves should be located at each sink and toilet and at your water heater. Individual gas shut off valves should be located at every gas fired appliance (i.e. dryer, stove, water heater, furnace, fireplace, etc.)

Tip #5: Use your ladder safely

Ladders are involved in over 100,000 injuries each year. Be sure your ladder is set up properly, is in good working order and that you follow the manufacturer's instructions for safe use.

Tip #6: Install smoke and carbon monoxide detectors

A smoke detector should be installed in every bedroom and on every floor of your home. A CO detector should be installed within 15 feet of each bedroom or sleeping area.

Tip #7: Correct unsafe landings and stairways

Repair treads that are uneven, too narrow, sloped or loose. Install good lighting on landings and stairways. Repair or replace railings that are missing, loose or too low.
